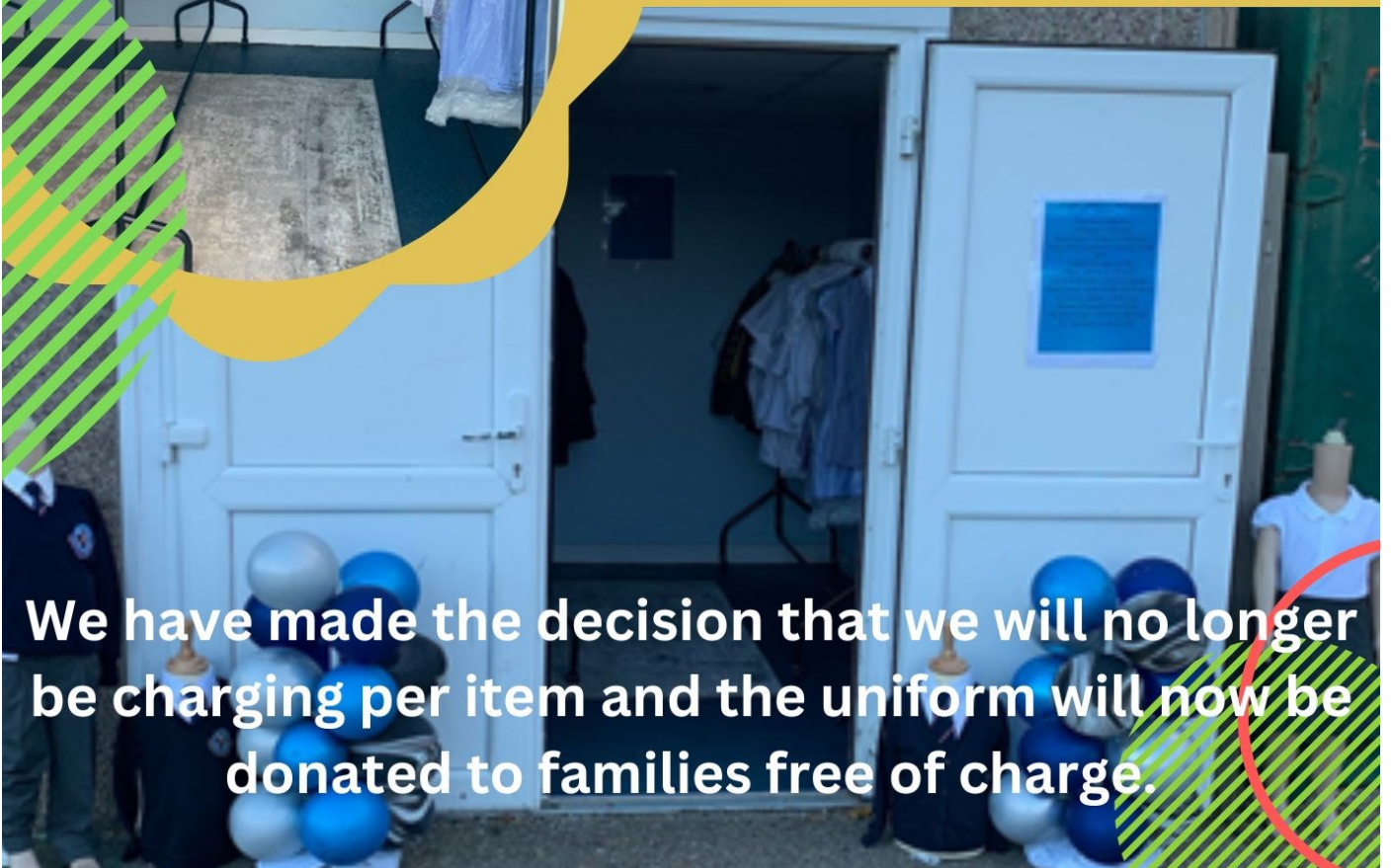
Home Visits will be carried out for any child that is absent for 3 or more school days without reason.

Reception

This week we have been learning all about our bodies and how to stay healthy. We have learnt about healthy eating, hand washing, looking after our teeth and all about mindfulness. We created our own posters to show people how to look after themselves, using pictures and labelling these with initial sounds. This week in Phonics we have learnt the sounds 'ck', 'e', 'u' and 'r'. We are beginning to practice segmenting and blending the sounds we already know to read CVC words. In Maths we have been continuing to look at comparing amounts, capacity, size and mass. We have been trying to use the correct language and explain our thinking.



On Friday we had our Curriculum Enrichment Day where we focussed on four different School Cooperative values and helping ourselves. These are Self-help, self-responsibility, democracy, equality, equity and solidarity. Each Teacher had a different activity planned which focussed on one or two of the values and the children moved around the classes. The activities included, biscuit making, team building games, competitive games and voting for an activity as a class. The children had so much fun completing all of their activities and all received a cooperative values certificate for their hard work.

Classroom catch up

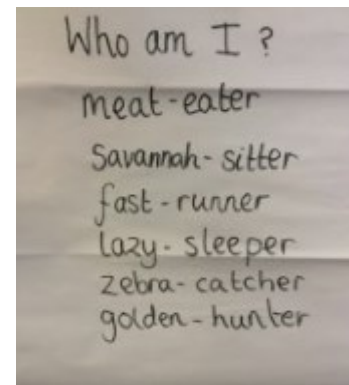
Year 1

This week year 1 have been looking at instruction writing. They explored the main features of instructions including the heading, sub headings, equipment and method. They also learned about imperative verbs. After this, year 1 had so much fun following a set of instructions on how to make a peg car. Where they will be writing their own set of instructions next week on this. We think their peg cars look amazing!



Year 2

This week in English we have been learning about kennings poems. We collected adjectives, verbs and nouns to create our own kennings poem. Can you guess what animal we are describing?

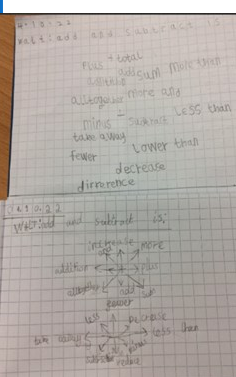


In our music lessons, we have been learning to sing the song Hands, Feet, Heart. We then practised playing the song with glockenspiels.

In geography we have been learning about the human and physical in Antarctica.

This week in Year 3

Currently our English lessons are inspired by the children's book 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura. At first, we familiarized ourselves with the story with drama activities and sequencing images and looked at different emotions characters might display. Then we learned about paragraphs



within writing, created Story Mountains to understand the different parts of the story, and then thought about what we could change in the story to create our own alternative version.



In maths, we have finally moved onto Addition and Subtraction. Firstly, reminding ourselves of the vocabulary we might come across when working within this unit. We have continued to apply our knowledge of Place value to solve addition and subtraction calculations of 2 and 3 digit numbers.

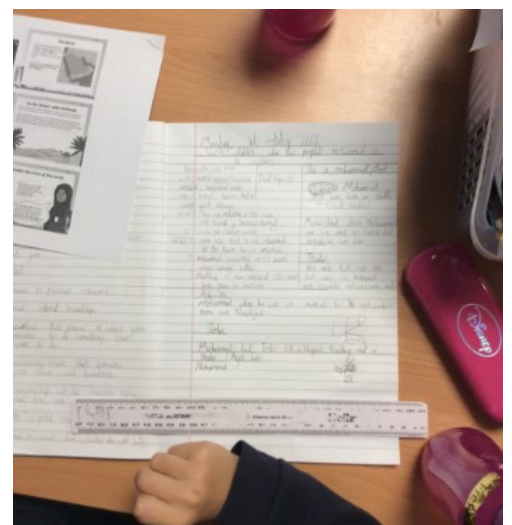
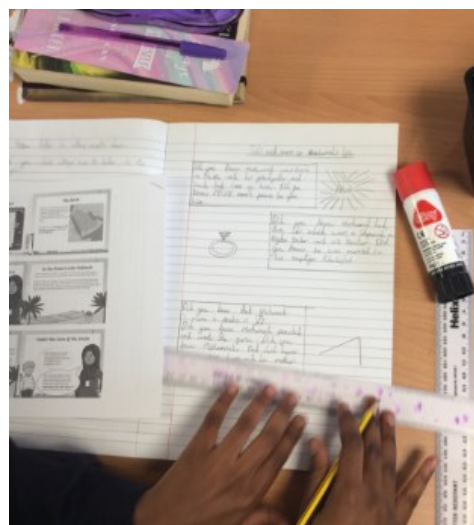
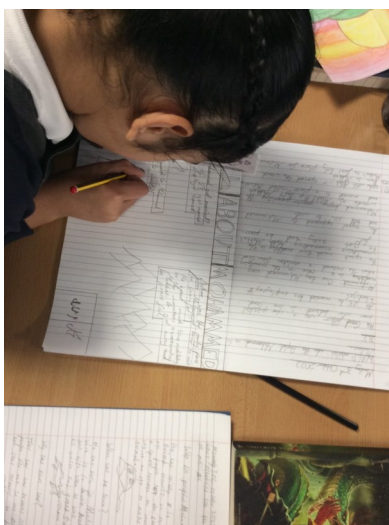


In Art, we used the technique of 'frottage' (taking rubbings from textured surfaces) to form the basis of a work of art. The artist Max Ernst created the term 'frottage', see the example we were inspired by and then look at some of our masterpieces.

Year 5 - Exploring a range of Sources

This week in Year 5, we have been exploring a plethora of sources across our foundation subjects - tomato, brown, mayonnaise - all kinds of sauces. Not really. We have actually been looking at primary and secondary sources of information to research a plethora of topics. In R.E. (pictured), we studied the life of Mohammed (pbuh) and how he spread the word of Islam - this also covered how religions are formed, as well as the importance of voicing beliefs and views respectfully. In history, we studied some pictures of viking artifacts as well as secondary sources such as write-ups, poetry and pictures of the era to make inferences from - our own budding historians.

Elsewhere, in mathematics, we have begun formal column methods for addition and subtraction. Whilst in English, we are planning our diary entries as 'Dreamgivers', providing others with exciting, creative dreams.

Year 6 News

This week, we have resumed our usual hard work in Year 6—after the majority of pupils were on residential at the end of last week; those who stayed in school also came away from our academic timetable to partake in some fun, interesting activities.

In English, we have been continuing our narrative focus on 'Francis' and pupils have been coming up with conspiracies as to what really happened to her in Quetico Park, as well as what the unknown entity which is to blame might have looked like. Pupils have had the challenging task to come up with descriptions for the 'being' without actually having any description to go on—they have been using their imaginations to consider what it could have been.



During Maths, pupils have been using various mathematical skills across the different groups: some have been looking at factors and multiples, others at multiplying and dividing and some have been working on their addition and subtraction skills. All of these sessions have been working towards finding quick and effective ways of solving test-style problems.

P.E—We have continued to hone our basketball skills by showing off what we have learnt in match-based scenarios. Pupils have been taking part in tournament-style matches across the year group and they have shown solidarity and resilience in an attempt to get the desired outcome of scoring as many baskets as possible.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

BEREAL

BeReal is the latest trending social media app. The concept is that people see others in their authentic day-to-day lives, sharing candid photos without editing or applying filters. Each day at a random time, users are simultaneously notified to take a picture of what they're doing at that exact moment. The two-minute window to submit an image means there's no time to select a particularly glamorous or exciting activity. BeReal shares two pictures: a selfie, and an image of the immediate surroundings. Users can only view and react to their friends' photos once they upload their own.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

CONTINUOUS NOTIFICATIONS

Like any social media app, BeReal's developers want users to be on it regularly and scrolling for long periods. BeReal only sends one notification to post a picture each day, but there are other alerts for events such as mentions, comments, friend requests and reactions to your photo. This can cause young users to feel pressure to open the app and respond, distracting them from other activities.

CONNECTING WITH STRANGERS

When someone signs up to BeReal, it highlights anyone in their phone's contacts list who already has the app – so users can connect with friends, or invite others from their contacts. The 'Discovery' feed, meanwhile, shows posts from strangers and gives users the option to add them as friends, too. This means your child could potentially connect with – and communicate with – a stranger.

PUBLIC SHARING

As well as sharing posts with friends in the moment, the app also allows posts to be shared publicly and public content to be viewed. Before a user can see this public content, they must post their own photo first. Unfortunately, there currently seems to be a lack of moderation on the content that's being uploaded, so a young user could be exposed to posts which aren't suitable for their age.

EASY LOCATION

BeReal's default setting is to share the exact location of where a post was sent from. Given that images are usually shared within the two-minute window, anyone your child's friends with on the app will know exactly where they are (or at least, where they were two minutes earlier). As we've noted, this could include strangers who are intending to use this geographical information for malicious purposes.

VISIBLE PERSONAL DATA

As with any other form of social media, it's important that your child doesn't share too much personal information on their profile. BeReal allows for a photo, full name, approximate location and a short bio. It's safest to make sure that your child's profile doesn't display anything which could identify where they go to school or exactly where they live.

REPUTATIONAL DAMAGE

What your child says and does online – their digital footprint – shapes the way that other people see them. It's essential that young people understand that when they post something online, they are giving the app in question the right to do whatever they wish with that image or content, including sharing it elsewhere. This form of permission is explicitly referenced in BeReal's terms of use.

Advice for Parents & Carers

LIMIT NOTIFICATIONS

BeReal offers the option to turn off individual types of notification. Doing this will significantly reduce the number of times your child is tempted to open the app by incoming comments, uploads, friend requests and so on. Ironically, it will allow them to actually 'be real' by being present in the moment and their current environment as opposed to being engrossed on social media.

STOP AND THINK

BeReal's goal is for users to be authentic with friends, removing the pressure of that flawless photo or perfectly worded post. It's still vital, though, that children stop and think rather than uploading something risky just to meet the two-minute deadline. Point out to them what kind of information strangers could extract from an image: school crests, street names or local landmarks, for example.

KEEP IT AMONG FRIENDS

Remind your child why adding strangers to their contacts isn't a good idea, and advise them to decline any friend requests from people they don't know in real life. If something your child sees on BeReal makes them feel uncomfortable, they can report it by clicking on the three dots in the top right. The reporting tool allows them to state the reason that they're flagging up the post.

CREATE A SAFE PROFILE

Remind your child to use an avatar as their profile pic (as opposed to a photo of themselves) and use a nickname or just their first name, not their full name. Any information they add to their bio (which is optional) should be kept vague, and personal details should remain private. It's also worth turning off the geolocation feature either through the device's settings or in BeReal itself.
