Absence

If your child is too ill to attend school, this must be reported to us by no later than **9.00am**. Please Telephone the school, press one and leave a message on the voicemail box stating your child's full name, class, the reason for absence and when we can expect them to return to school (if known).

Home Visits will be carried out for any child that is absent for 3 or more school days without reason.

POLITE NOTICE

We have had a number of reports of unsafe parking in the local area from drivers presumed to be collecting children from school. Please may we ask that, if you must drive to collect your child from school, your car is left somewhere that will not present a danger to pedestrians.

We are incredibly fortunate to have the improved carpark at the memorial park but, as it is not part of the school's property, we have no control over the length of time it is taking to complete. Once finished, this should provide more spaces and make parking safely much easier.

We must also reiterate that the driveway and turning point are NOT to be used as a place to park to collect children. Only those with prior arrangements to access the school car park should be entering the driveway.

Reception

Our learning this week was based on the story, What the Ladybird Heard by Julia Donaldson. In literacy, we have been creating wanted posters for the sneaky Hefty Hank and Lanky Len, using adjectives to describe their appearances and explaining what they are wanted for. We have been working hard on applying our phonics knowledge, using known sounds to begin to string some CVC words together to create a short sentence. Some of us have been using expanded noun phrases in our sentences to make them more interesting.

In maths, we have focussed on maps. We learned that maps show information about a place and help us find our way around places. They can show large places, such as the world, or smaller places, such as a town or zoo. Sometimes, maps can be used on a phone, tablet or computer. Then, we had a go at drawing our own maps through the week, using stories to help us.

Also, this week, we had our curriculum enrichment day. We looked at the natural world, different habitats and the animals that we find there. Each class was transformed into a different habitat—jungle, ocean, garden and savannah We had the opportunity to explore each classroom and participate in a variety of activities. 
Year One

In maths this week, we have focussed on telling the time using an analogue clock. We learnt that the hour hand is shorter than the minute hand. Once we were confident at identifying these hands correctly, we went on to learn that when the minute hand is pointing directly to 12, it is the o'clock time and it is important that we look at the shorter hand to see which hour it is. After, we discussed telling the time to half past the hour noting that the minute hand points to 6 and the hour hand is just past the hour. We had lots of fun working in pairs to set the time on the clock.

Furthermore, we had our curriculum enrichment day this week. We looked at creating 3D drawings and began the day by discussing and recalling as many 3D shapes as we could from our previous lessons. We went on to draw different 3D shapes in our sketch books and then thought about the different shapes we could make using strips of paper, including, waves, zigzags, and spirals. After this, we enjoyed manipulating strips of paper into 3D shapes and

followed our design to create our own 3D drawings.







This week has been a busy one! First, we were so excited to invite our grown ups into our classrooms to see all of our hard work from the year! We have also been very busy in English writing letters to our new teachers, to tell them a little bit about ourselves. We discussed our family, our favourite subjects and what we like to do when we are outside of school. We really enjoyed writing these letters!







Year 3

We have enjoyed our last full week in year three. For our English lessons we have been writing a Diary entry based on a video clip we have watched, this was about going on an adventure.

During PE this week, we played a range of team games, and we were allowed to use a range of sports equipment with our friends on the school field.

In Maths this week, we have been learning how to interpret and draw pictograms and bar charts. We picked a topic each, we gathered data using a tally chart from our peers, then created our own pictogram and bar chart.

In Art this week we have made abstract 3D structures, from our plans. We were only allowed to use tabs, string, slots, folding and twisting of the cardboard to hold them together and NO GLUE!

For our enrichment day this half term we focused on History, and we all dressed like Romans. We continued to learn about the Romans and made our own Roman shields.

Year 4

In year 4 this week, we have been analysing the features of biographies, focussing on a range of famous athletes, authors and scientists. By the end of the week, we spent time interviewing our classmates about their lives so far, and we began to write our own biography based on what they told us. In history, we explored Ancient Egyptian pyramids, where we looked into how they were built, who built them and what measures they had to protect their valuables. Some tense quick-cricket matches took place during PE, where play was of such a quality, that the competition must now carry on into next week!

Year 5 - Art show on Monday!

This week in Year 5 and across the school, we have had an open evening for parents, where books and art were on display. The art was so brilliant, we wanted to share it with you all! 
