





#### Reception

Our learning this week was based on the story, Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne. In literacy, we have been working hard on applying our phonics knowledge. Lots of us have been using known sounds to begin to string some CVC words together to create a short sentence, while some of us have been using expended noun phrases in our sentences to make them more interesting. Later on in the week, we read the story Handa's Hen, also by Eileen Browne, and compared the similarities and differences between the two stories.

In maths, we have focussed on sharing. We have been practising sharing items and objects into 2 equal groups, ensuring it is fair. Also, we noticed that, sometimes, there are items and objects left over when we share or group. Therefore, we have been coming up with suggestions on how to resolve this.

In PE, this week, we have been practising different sports day activities ahead of sports day next week. We are very excited about our grown-ups coming to watch us!

Also, this week, we celebrated Father's Day. We spent the day participating in activities related to the celebration after discussing how Father's Day began, why it is celebrated, who is celebrated and what we do to celebrate.









#### Year One


In Maths this week, we looked at partitioning numbers. We chose a number






between 10 and 50 and used dienes to show how many tens and ones are in our chosen number. We understood that if a number ended in '0' this number had 0 ones in it.

In English this week, Starry-eyed-Stan wrote to year 1 with a super, duper task. He is having a music concert and wants the children to design a poster. The children



identified the features of a poster and how to use persuasive adjective in their sentences. They used the skills they learnt this week and created beautiful posters for Stan. Well done year 1!





















#### Year 3

We have had a busy week in Year 3 this week, for our English lessons we have been creating our own hero/heroine and mythical creature characters for our quest myths.

During our PE lessons, we have been practicing our skills for sports day. We have been learning how to work and complete activities as a team.

In Maths this week, we continued to learn about time, we have been using clocks to make times and turn them into 24-hour digital times. We have also been

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using our skills to work out start and finish times when knowing the duration of events.

In Art this week we are learning to combine 2D objects to make 3D structures with and without glue and cello tape. The children were very creative and enjoyed engaging in this lesson.

Our history lesson this week was all about the famous Roman aqueducts, we used Chromebooks to research facts about the history of these. We also researched about Julius Caesar and shared lots of facts about his life.

#### Year 4

This week in English, we have completed grammar activities such as how to accurately use a semi-colon and imperative verbs. We continued looking at instruction texts, by the end of the week the children would have created a set of accurate instructions on how to create a sandwich. In maths, the children have started their times table test. As always, we are encouraged to revise and practice our timetable knowledge for the statutory year 4 times tables test which has started this week. Pupils are familiar with the times tables links posted in the 'Timestable' folder on Google classrooms and songs on YouTube shown in class. In PE, the children are in the second week of quick cricket, we have been learning how to catch and bat accurately. Within Science, we have started a new topic on the water cycle. Finally, in History, we have learnt about the discovery of King Tutankhamun, who discovered him and the implications that were faced. Within the history lesson, we

mummified a banana by reconstructing the

embalming process.

#### Year 5

It has certainly been a **sizzling** week in Year 5 with the hot weather, but year 5 have been working just as hard!

In English, we have been writing persuasive letters to none other than the amazing David Walliams! They are inviting him to visit our school and support reading. Our letters feature a 'zoom out to zoom in', some powerful quotations and some hard hitting statistics - who knows, maybe he'll accept the invite?

In Maths, we have had our minds blown, looking at translations and symmetry. In science, our budding scientists learned all about the development of an embryo, and how a mother can look after an embryo. Pupils were incredibly mature when discussing this, and asked some amazing questions!

What a week we have had in Year 5! Enjoy the sunshine this weekend!

#### POSSIBLE EXPLOITATION


Discussions about avoiding being recruited as a many mule are also good apportunities for a refresher with your child about financial responsibility and good movey management. #### STAY INFORMED

Criminals' methods and approaches to recruiting young people as money mules frequently evolve to reflect the online landscape. Try to stay aware of criminals' current tactics and make time to regularly check out resources previded by schools, law enforcement and financial organisations. 
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



#### REPORT YOUR SUSPICIONS


