Classoom catch up

Year 1

Year 1's science topic this term is everyday materials. They have been exploring the different materials around them, identifying their properties and using different language around this. In addition, they have been learning about natural and manmade materials where they are now able to sort a range of materials into these categories. The children are thoroughly enjoying what has taken place so far in science this half term and are excited to continue to learn more about materials.



Year 2

In English, we have been focusing on describing settings. We created our own Savanna setting using papers, pictures and colouring pencils. We used these to imagine what it was like there, which helped us describe the setting. We also used on Similes to help make our description more interesting.



In Geography we have been looking at the continent of Africa. we then focused on Nairobi. We looked at the human and physical features that Nairobi have and then we compared them to East Tilbury.








Year 3







In Maths this week the children have been solving word problems that involved using their understanding of place value.

They chose the manipulatives they wanted to use to sup-











YEAR 4

This week in year four, we have explored numerous Anglo-Saxon artefacts. The skills we focussed on were paraphrasing and note-taking, and we worked incredibly hard at out first attempt at this.



In science we got ourselves into all sorts of trouble (with liquorice of course) when we investigated how to classify animals using their physical features. We identified similarities and differences between the Liquorice Allsorts and then linked we linked this to different animal types.



Year 5



The Year 5 pupils have enjoyed an exciting week of research, experiments and discussion. It has been great to see their determination and self responsibility as they have continued to step up and take more ownership over aspects of their learning.

During our PSHE lesson, pupils considered what peer pressure is and how this can impact decision making. Did you know that two thirds of people would follow a group decision that they knew to be wrong? Pupils learnt that it is okay to voice their own opinion about something, doing so politely leaves space for others to disagree with something too.

On Tuesday, pupils had the opportunity to carry out some self-led research into their topic for this half term, Vikings! using a range of web links, pupils considered key themes including clothes, homes, transport and jobs from Viking times and compared them to now.









Year 6 News

This week Year 6 have been continuing to explore the use of photos in art, with some children experimenting with macro photography. They used iPads to take extremely close up photos and produced some amazing artwork, worthy of wall art!



The children have also been looking forward to their residential trip to Stubbers and have been away since Wednesday evening, participating in activities such as climbing, orienteering and paddle boarding. Photos from the trip will be shared in next week's newsletter.



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Instagram is a highly popular social media platform with over 1 billion users. Instagram is continuously updating and adding new features to meet the needs of users. Instagram allows users to upload images and videos to their feed, create interactive 'stories', go live, exchange private messages or search, explore and follow other accounts they like.

ADDICTION

PRODUCT TAGGING

Product tags allow users (particularly influencers who are sponsored to advertise products) to tag a product or business in their post. This tag takes viewers, regardless of age, directly to the product detail page on the shop where the item can be purchased and where children may be encouraged by influencers to purchase products they don't necessarily need.

EXCLUSION AND OSTRACISM

Young people are highly sensitive to ostracism. Feeling excluded can come in many forms such as: not receiving many 'likes', not being tagged, being unfriended, having a photo untagged, or not receiving a comment or reply to a message. Being excluded online hurts just as much as being excluded offline – with children potentially suffering lower moods, lower self-esteem, feeling as if they don't belong or undervalued.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

Buy Milk

GOING LIVE

Live streaming on Instagram allows users to connect with friends and followers in real-time and comment on videos during broadcast. Risks increase if the account is public because anyone can watch and comment on their videos, including strangers. However, other risks include acting in ways they wouldn't normally or being exposed to inappropriate content or offensive language.
