# Reception

We are all pleased to be back to school after the half term holidays. This week in literacy we have been reading the story Mrs Armitage on Wheels written by Quentin Blake. We had to think about what we would add onto a bike of our own, such as a seat, a basket and some fast wheels. We are getting better at thinking about the sounds that are in words.


In maths this week we have been looking closely at numbers 1, 2 and 3. We have been practising writing the numbers and matching amounts to the numbers.

We will be celebrating fireworks night tomorrow so today we have been learning the story about Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot.

Here is some of our amazing work!













In science we investigated floating and sinking. We first began by predicting what objects would float and what would sink. After this, we then carried out an experiment to investigate whether our predictions were correct. We began by placing the objects into a clear container full of water. We each took it in turns to place an object into the water where we could clearly see if our predictions were correct or not.

In Maths this week, we have been learning about part whole models. We had lots of fun working in pairs to develop our understanding of the use of the part whole model. We used numicon to create the two parts of the model, and then worked together to work out the whole. We extending our learning by having a whole number and working out what two numbers (parts) we could add together to make the whole. We identified that there could be multiple numbers that add together to make the same number.







Its been a busy first week back to school in year 2!






We have been learning about photography and how to use devices to take high quality photographs. Once we understood the importance of lighting, angles and having a secure grip on the camera, we took our very own photographs using the iPads.







In English we have been designing our very own dragons! We designed our own dragons in preparation to write a story about them! We also described our dragons using expanded noun phrases and similes. Aren't they fantastic?





In Science, we have been looking at the Arctic regions and finding out more how animals have adapted to live there.

# YEAR THREE

After a refreshing break, we have really enjoyed our first week back at school catching up with our friends and teachers.

We were excited to discover that a toy factory had written to us asking for our help to test and discover the best material for a ramp for toy cars. This experiment was the beginning of our learning in Science about Forces and Magnets and children discussed predictions and the importance of a fair test.

In Music, the children had lots of fun learning how to play different notes on the glockenspiel and together we created a wonderful piece of music! We worked very hard to keep the beat.

We continue to enjoy learning about the Stone Age through the book Ug, in English and have enjoyed the challenge of column addition and subtraction in Maths.

# Year 4

Welcome back to another half term! We hope that you were all well rested. This week in science, we considered the various animal food chains thought about different examples which they recorded and discussed.

In music, pupils were encouraged to use various body percussion movements and their voices to break down various components of our song this term, Mamma Mia!

As ever, we continue to encourage both pupils and their families to practice timetables. As previously mentioned, there is a statutory times tables test that will take place in the summer term. Weekly, pupils will participate in times table tests, practice online and have the opportunity to sing times tables songs. 




