Could all children please have a PE kit in school

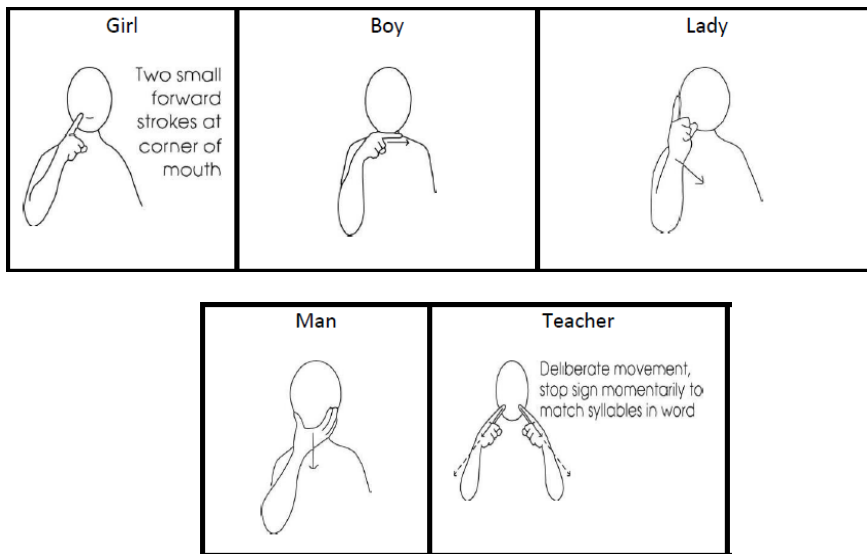

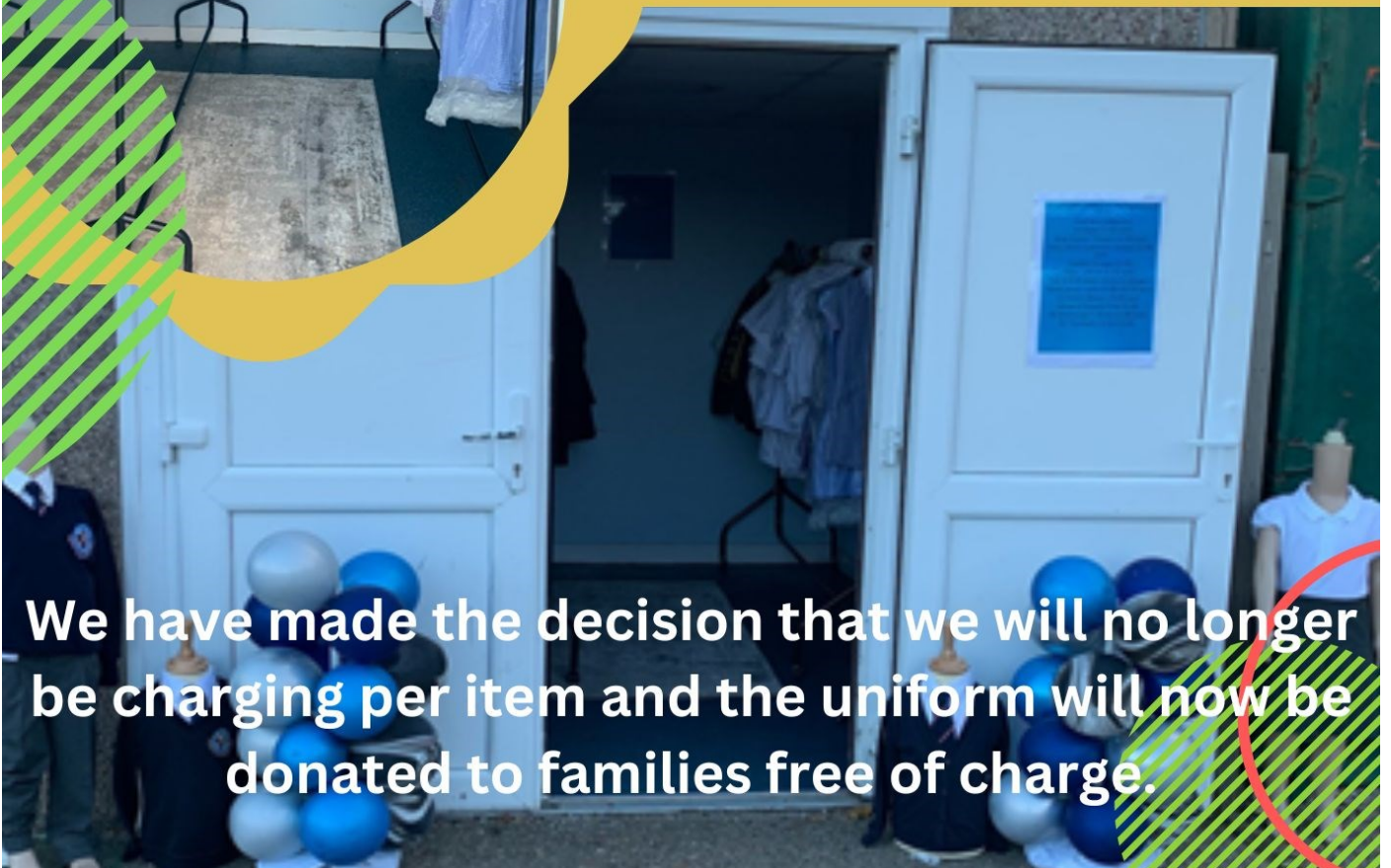

This week in Reception we have been looking at the story of The Three Little Pigs. We have looked at the materials used for building their houses and discussed if we could use something else that might be better. We have also acted out the story as a class.

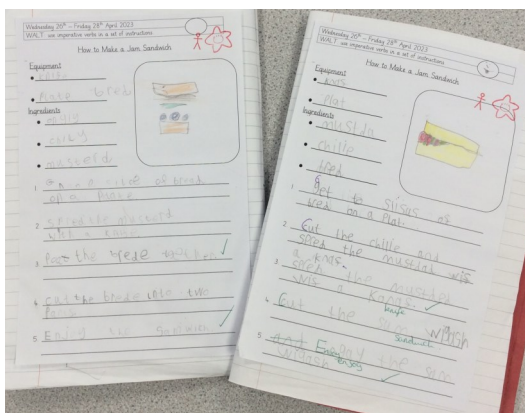
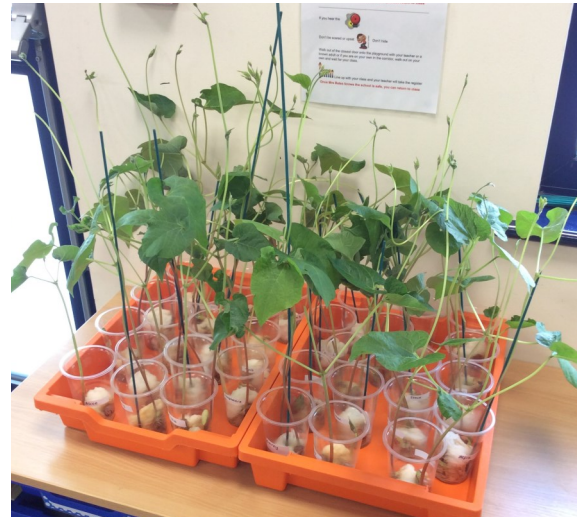
In maths we are looking at matching different shapes. We have rotated some shapes to see if we can find the shape which is the same. We have done this by looking at pictures and using models made with blocks. We have also looked at tangrams and decided which shapes we need to make a picture.

We have also completed lots of activities around the coronation. We have designed crowns, made flags and looked at some pictures of King Charles. We have also had a picnic lunch together to celebrate.

Year 1

Year 1 have had so much fun watching their bean plants grow. We cannot believe how quickly they have grown in two weeks!

Year 1 have been completing their bean diaries to monitor the growth of their beans. They have done incredibly well to remember to water their beans regularly, and ensure they get enough sunlight to help their beans grow big and strong.



In English, year 1 have been focusing on instructional writing. As a whole class, the pupils instructed their class teacher on how to make a jam sandwich. If the children said put the butter on the bread, the teacher physically put the tub of butter on the bread. This helped the children understand the importance of having clear instructions so mistakes aren't made.

After this, the pupils wrote their own set of instructions on how to make a sandwich of their choice.



Year 2

In English we have continued our writing about the Great Fire of London. We have researched facts about Samuel Pepys. We also described the fire using our senses. We wrote down some amazing ideas!

It's been a short, but fun filled week in Year Three!

The children are becoming experts at using glockenspiels. Our teamwork and timing has improved so much and we are really enjoying playing different songs together.

As part of our Light topic in Science, due to the sunny weather we have been having, this week we learnt how to protect our eyes. We examined the effects of light on our pupils and discussed ways to keep ourselves safe. We have begun an interesting experiment which examines the damaging effects of UV rays - watch this space!

We have finished the week celebrating the King's Coronation. Everyone looked festive in their red, white and blue and we enjoyed our picnic!

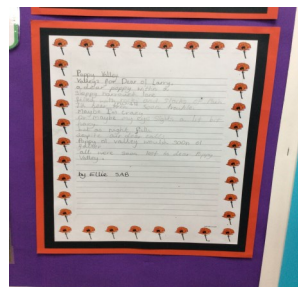
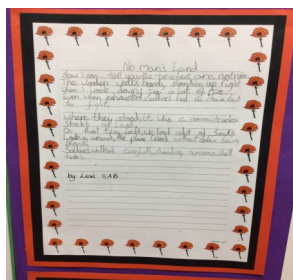
Year 4

This week in year four, we have spent our English lessons exploring Ancient Egyptian myths. This led perfectly into our study of the Egyptian deities, where we did drama-based history lessons. In preparation for the King's coronation, we designed bunting to help decorate the year group area, and completed tasks based around our new monarch.

YEAR 5

Biographies, Bees and the Coronation.

This week year 5 have completed their biographies to conclude their English topic. We have been researching different people who were involved in World War 1 and used this information to write biographies about them. This has enabled us to look at different perspectives of the war. Some pupils have been so inspired by their new topic, that they have written poems at home.



We all became bees in science this week, as we carried out an experiment about pollination. We were able to recreate the process that pollinators use to enable plants to make new seeds and reproduce. Our bees were very busy and were able to collect lots of pollen and transfer it onto the next 'flower'.



In maths, we have continued to look at angles, using protractors to draw and measure them accurately. We will be using this to help us to move onto looking at shape for our next topic. This will also help us with our creative activities for the coronation on Friday. We will be making decorations and taking part in lots of fun crafts and a themed lunch.

Though the children have been working extremely hard on SATs preparation and revision, they have been conducting some interesting investigations in their foundation lessons too...

In science, we have been further exploring our topic of *Evolution and Inheritance*. This week, we have been learning about Darwin's theory of evolution and how he observed beak adaptations in finches. To further understand this, we did an experiment where we used different pieces of equipment to act as different types of beaks and had to use them to collect as much 'food' as possible. There was rice, macaroni, marshmallows, multilink and paper clips to act as different sized and shaped bird food. We used tweezers, scissors, spoons and pegs to act as different beak types. We looked at different shaped bird beaks and talked about why birds have evolved to have so many different shapes of beak, establishing that it is to do with their specialist or general feeding requirements. We had great fun with this investigation and quickly realised that particular beak types are very suited to finding and collecting different food types in different environments.

Good luck with SATs next week—you will all be amazing!!

10 top tips for safely using SMARTWATCHES

Kids love gadgets, and smartwatches – available to buy from as little as £20 online – make a tempting gift. As with any type of mobile technology, though, smartwatches can pose risks to children unless they're used safely. Receiving unwanted calls, cyber-stalking and distracting a young person when they're crossing the road are all known risks associated with smartwatches. However, these devices can bring plenty of benefits for children and parents alike – so let's examine the pros and cons of smartwatches.

AVOID CHEAP OPTIONS

A quick search online yields a torrent of cheap smartwatches for kids, costing as little as £20. It's wise to avoid this bargain basement tech: it tends to deliver a poor experience with inferior battery life, and it's hard to have faith in the software's safety. There have been cases of smartwatches being hacked to track or contact children; stick to known brands who have a reputation to protect.

CONTROL CALLING

Many smartwatches have the facility to make or take calls. As with a phone, you may want to restrict who your child can call – or be called by. On Apple Watches, you can select trusted contacts who are allowed to ring your child, while other watches' controls vary hugely. Some need to connect to a linked phone for calls, so you may be able to block unknown contacts via that device instead.

BEWARE HIDDEN COSTS

For a smartwatch to allow calls independently (that is, without being connected to a phone via Bluetooth), it will need its own mobile data plan. This might take the form of a tiny SIM card that you slot into the watch – or an eSIM, where the physical card is replaced by software settings. Either way, this will incur an additional monthly cost that you'll need to factor into any buying decision.

ENABLE FAMILY SHARING

Apple Watches aren't cheap, but they do offer superb safety features – allowing parents to control calls, messages and emails on the device, as well as a location tracking system that can send alerts if kids wander beyond pre-set boundaries. Their SOS function enables children to contact emergency services instantly if they're in trouble, which simultaneously also alerts parents and carers.

MAKE THEM COOL FOR SCHOOL

Some schools have banned smartwatches, as pupils have been using them as substitute phones. If your child's school does permit them, some devices can be set to prevent distractions in class. For example, Apple's Schooltime feature turns their watches into ordinary time-keeping devices during school hours. The display changes in this mode, showing teachers that it isn't being used for other purposes.

BE MINDFUL OF BEDTIME

Many smartwatches offer sleep tracking, which some (usually older) children use to justify wearing them to bed. However, that also presents a temptation to message friends or check social media late at night, even if their phone is downstairs. Unless there's a valid reason not to, you could encourage your child to remove the watch in the evenings and ensure the charger stays in a different room.

TRACK ITS LOCATION

Both Apple and Android devices have apps which allow you to track a smartwatch's location. They can also initiate an audio alert – avoiding those cushion-hurling panics when a treasured device can't be found at home. If you're planning to track your child's location via their watch, make them aware of that in advance. You could even make it a condition of them getting the watch in the first place.

THINK 'SAFETY FIRST'

Smartwatches are often worth hundreds of pounds, which can make young people wearing one a target for thieves. Advise your child to keep the watch hidden in public (when possible) and not to resist if muggers demand their watch. If you manage to track a stolen device, pass that information to the police; location data isn't always accurate, so you could end up wrongly accusing someone.

STORE MEDICAL INFO

Devices including the Samsung Galaxy Watch and Apple Watch can store the owner's medical details (such as their blood group and any pre-existing medical conditions), potentially giving emergency services access to vital information in a crisis. These devices also have heart rate detection, which sends a text message to selected contacts along with a map showing the wearer's location.

USE THEM AS MOTIVATION

If you're worried your child's spending too much time slumped on the sofa staring at screens, smartwatches are great fitness trackers and can be a powerful incentive to get moving. Some devices will alert the wearer if they've been inactive for a long time and encourage them to do some exercise. Many watches record the user's daily step count and measure other health metrics.

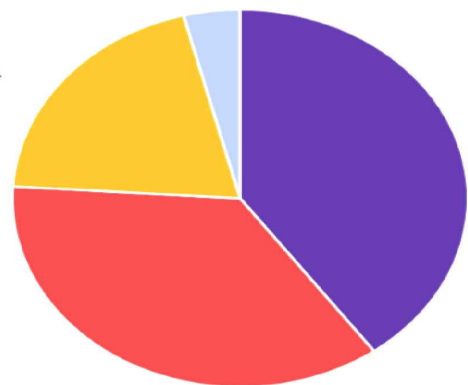

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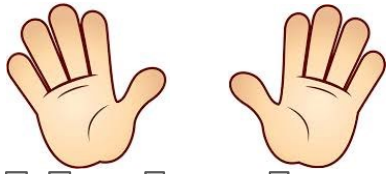

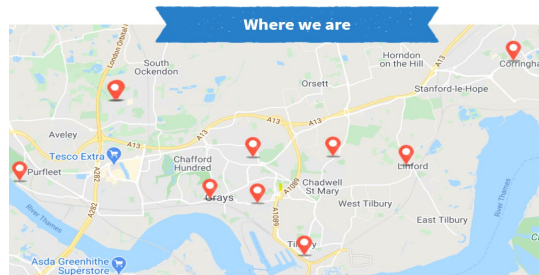
