



Starving the Anxiety Gremlin is a book by Kate Collins-Donnelly, a successful child therapist and psychologist. The book focuses on teaching children about the emotion called anxiety. It looks at what anxious thoughts they may have and how they might feel when they experience these. It also teaches them strategies to manage these anxious thoughts and feelings and hopefully, as a result, help them become more confident as they grow older. These parent/carer sessions are based on the theory from these books and will be referred to throughout.

The sessions will give you a good understanding of anxiety through self-reflection, focussing on your own experiences, which will help you support your child at home with a wider understanding of their needs. The programme is split into three sessions:


Session 1: Understanding the theory of anxiety

Reception


This week in Reception we have been learning about minibeasts. We read a story called 'Mad about Minibeasts'. We have discussed that minibeasts do not have an internal skeleton and they sometimes have a shell instead. We have also compared them and used adjectives to see if our friends could guess which minibeast we are thinking about.

We have caterpillars in Miss Beverley's classroom and we are going to watch how they grow and change!

In maths we have been looking at doubling. We have doubled the numbers on a dice and we have used butterflies to see the spots double on their wings when we fold them. We have also played a doubling game together where we tried to trick each other by making our friends guess which number we have made with the bricks and then doubling them together.

Year One


In English this week we enjoyed listening to the story 'Starry-Eyed Stan'. We had lots of fun working in groups to act out the key parts from the story, thinking carefully about what the characters would have said and how they would move. We enjoyed working as a team and can see some great film stars. We also sequenced the story and then by recalling the story, we created a storyboard.



This week we learnt about democracy, what it means and how it affects our lives. We discussed what it is to be part of democracy and how we use a voting system



to decide on our government. We each thought of our own law that we would like to follow in our classroom, such as chocolate for snack and longer lunchtime! We then went head -to-head to persuade our peers to vote for us. A secret vote was held, and we were able to choose a winner by putting our hands up. We discussed how a secret vote made it easier to choose which rule is preferred and not just vote for our friends. We had lots of fun learning about democracy and taking part in a voting system.

















Year Three

We are so pleased to be back at school this week in the glorious sunshine!

In Maths we have continued the topic of time, learning all about days, weeks, months and years and had lots of fun singing and dancing to songs to help us remember!

In French, we learnt all about how to say different types of food and played games involving a picnic and a dragon.

Children have been especially kind this week and supportive of one another which is so lovely to see. In PSHE they have been talking about how to manage setbacks and how to build resilience.

This Summer term, pupils will be doing Quick Cricket and Rounders as their sports in PE.




Welcome to the jungle!

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

STRANGER DANGER

While young people generally know not to share personal information with strangers, the safety of their home and the distance offered by suchrology can make them feel more naked and uninhibited. Combined with the fact that Cme I'v provides a webchaf function – and anonymity – it can be an easy way for groomers to gather information ask to connect on other social media platforms, or potentially request infinite tempers.

EXPLICIT CONTENT

Unfortunately, there are a lot of users who use OrneTV's webcom feature to expose themselves. While users can swipe to the next call quickly, it's not something that can be filtered out competely – so young people could easily be exposed to highly inoppropriate Images.

REPORTING DIFFICULTIES

When video calling, the other person's username is other hidden and therefore they con't be blocked or reported. There is a Report Abuse' tab at the bottom of the video, but the speed with which calls can swipe post con move it difficult to use this system. There's also little evidence to suggest that offenders are dealt with appropriately (through warnings or account termination, for

OmeTV is another app which encourages users to "make friends from all around the world": People can search profiles by age and gender and send direct messages or photos. However, the app is primarily used for video calls. When using this feature, users are connected at random, although only their country of origin is shared. People can then either chapse to move on to the rest chaffer can stay in that call for as long to the rest.


Although the site stokes that users must be 18 or ever, there's no way to verify this, and it's easy to use an existing facebook account to log in, or for users to eat up a loke occount. To access Omet'v, users simply need to press a button confirming they're an actut, which means it is likely many users will claim to be much older than they are.

VIDEO RECORDING

When young people are chatting live on a webcom, they could be coased by others into doing things they don't feet comfortable doing, or persuaded that no harm can come from it. What they don't know is whether the other user is recording them. These videos could then be used to embarross or blockmall them, or they could be kept by a potential online predetor.

LIMITED PARENTAL CONTROLS

OmeTV has very limited parental controls. There is a 'safe mode', but this is of little proctical use given that explicit content isn't literact out. While the site lists several rules and regulations, there are lew appaired ways to enforce them or restrict what users can see or do.



FOLLOW AGE GUIDELINES

Ome IV has an age recommendation of 18 and over, which suggests the developers are owner that it may facilitate adult content. It's important to adhere to the age guidelines and try to restrict access to the agp for younger users. If you find it on an under-IE's device, talk to them about the potentia risks and explain why they probably shouldn't be using it.

DISCOURAGE CHATS WITH STRANGERS

Remind your child of the dengers of talking to strongers online. The anonymity OmeTV affers, plus its webchat function, makes it an attractive place for groomers to network and create inappropriate content. Explain that your child may see something which upsets them — and that it's a crime for anyone to expose themselves to a young person online.

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

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Some people assume that anime is safe for children purely because its animation. However, a large amount is actually geomet towards adults, other featuring sweating, graphic violence and hadity. Many anime series follow dark storylines, such as Cyberpunic Edgerunners, which has swittly became known for its extreme gore, sexual content and disturbing depictions of mental.

COMMON CROSSOVERS

it's easy for children to get drawn into anime through its many crossovers into video gomes, such as Forthite and Coll of Duty, while anime art styles are often used for other products, due its popularity. Watching this content alongside your child isn't only a way to spend quality time together. It will also help you to spot quite quickly if there's potential to any difficult topics to arise in the show.

IT'S NOT JUST TV

Anime is most often in the format of a TV series, but it is also presented as films. Studio Chibbl is often referred to as the Japanese Disney due to the quality and number of films they produce. 


