MESSAGE FROM THURROCK COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP

Essex Police have developed a campaign to raise awareness regarding cannabis edibles which we appear to have seen an increase in amongst our young people. Although it is not a new trend as such it would seem that more young people are consuming cannabis edibles and there is the concern that in some cases they have had fatal consequences in other areas of the country. Although it would seem a small number in terms of this product resulting in fatalities, there is concern when we look at the effects that they can result in once consumed, particularly if they are mixed/laced with an illicit commodity.

It is highly likely that younger children are targeted by gangs due to the edibles being made to look like sweets and therefore making them look more appealing to a younger audience to recruit them into drug lines activity.

On 12th July Essex Police launched their response in terms of raising the awareness of these edibles and is now on the Essex Police website so please share far and wide!

Classroom catch up

Reception

This week in Reception we have been reading the story 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. The story is about a Ladybird who hears of a plan to steal the prize cow from the farm she lives on and how she helps the other animals to save the day. We wrote sentences about the farm animals we heard about in the story. We have been checking our sentences for capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In maths we have been looking at numbers beyond 20 and have looked at the number patterns on a hundred square. We have also been counting backwards from 20 and we are getting really good at this.

We had an enrichment day on Friday where we tried lots of different tasks in all the reception classrooms to help us build resilience.

Year One

For our last curriculum enrichment day of the academic year, Year 1 focussed on developing their geography skills. We began the day by looking at what a compass is and why we use it. We understood that a compass is an important tool for finding direction and helps us to find our way when using a map. Then we spoke about the compass points (North, South, East and West) and why they are needed. After, we went outside of the classroom to explore our compasses and engaged in fun games of moving around the compass points placed around our playground.

Later in the morning, we discussed locations of different

British castles and identified which parts of the countries within the UK they are found. We then enjoyed working in pairs to correctly position each castle on the map. In the afternoon, we had lots of fun making our pirate ships out of junk modelling.

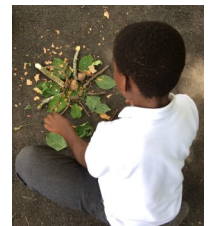


Year 2

It has been bread week in Year 2! We have been learning a range of techniques to safely prepare, knead the dough and bake the rolls. After discussing the importance of hygiene in small groups we all had an opportunity to add ingredients to a bowl and then kneaded the dough before shaping them into our rolls. Once the rolls were baked, we learned how to cut the roll, spread butter and grate cheese. After making our rolls, we were able to eat them or take them home to enjoy.



To finish off our materials unit in science we learned about natural and man-made materials. We discussed the differences between them and identified materials in school that would either be man-made or natural. Once we had a clear understanding as to the difference, we explored the artist Andy Goldsworthy; an artist who creates pieces of art using natural materials. After our discussion, we went outside to create our very own pieces of art using natural materials that we could find in the playground. We think they are great!



We can't believe this is our final Year 2 newsletter, we want to say a big thank you to all of the children for working incredibly hard and being enthusiastic about all our topics from Animals and their habitats in the Autumn term to The Great Fire of London in the Summer. We have had a fantastic year with you all and hope you have all loved it as much as we have!

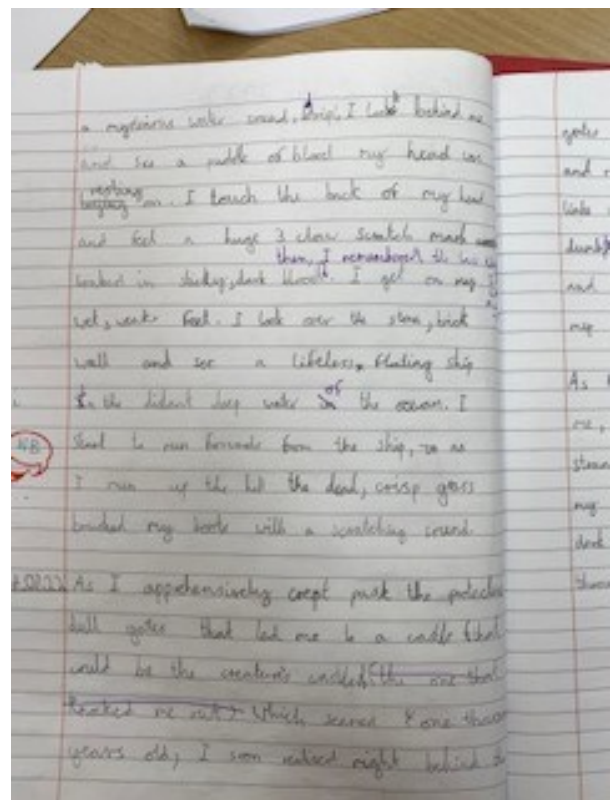
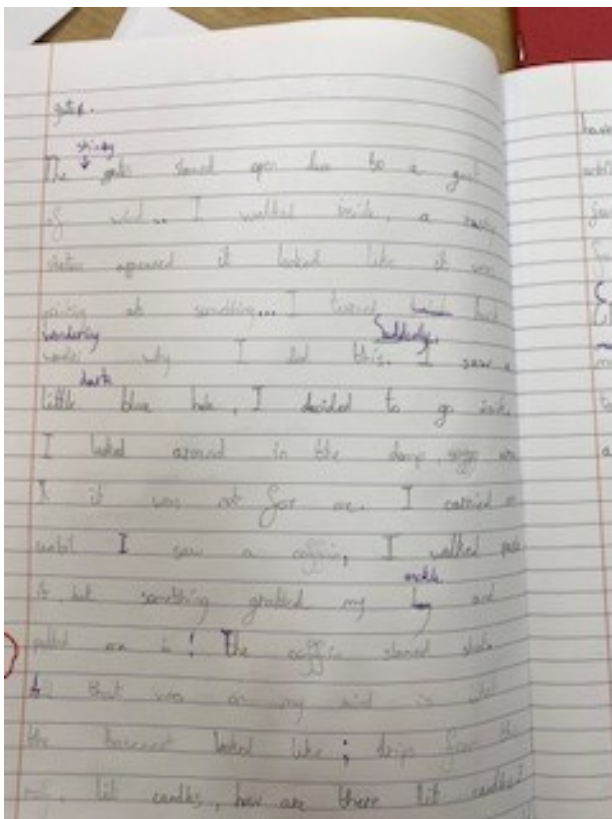


Year 5

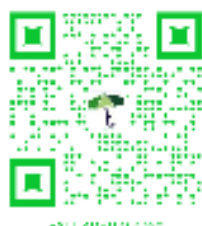

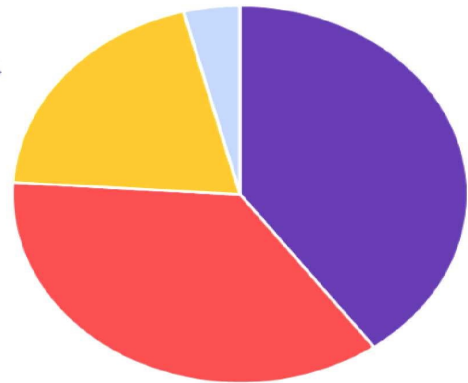

12 Ways to Champion EQUALITY ONLINE

In terms of the esteem it's held in, women's football has made impressive progress in a short space of time. That's a bit like the online world: it's come a long way, but that doesn't mean we should stop trying to make it even better. The Women's European Football Championships are underway, and that's a timely reminder of how important it is to give everyone the respect they deserve online – regardless of gender, race, sexual orientation, religion or anything else. In partnership with the Global Equality Commission, we've produced a special guide to help young fans kick online discrimination into touch!

1 KNOW IT WHEN YOU SEE IT

Expressing views based on prejudice about a part of someone's identity – their race, gender or a disability, say – counts as online hate.

2 WHEN "BANTER" ISN'T FUNNY

Discrimination is sometimes disguised as humour: some memes, clips or gifs that certain people try to pass off as "funny" might actually be offensive.

3 BE YOUR OWN PERSON

Set a good example through your own online communication. Think whether you'd say a thing in real life before posting or sharing it online for the world to see.

4 SEEING SHOULDN'T EQUAL BELIEVING

Sneakier, less obvious types of online abuse can stay on the internet for longer, so don't assume that something's OK just because it's not been taken down yet.

5 SEXISM CAN BE ILLEGAL

As well as being extremely hurtful to a person or a group, online sexism and prejudice against women (known as misogyny) can be recorded as a hate crime in some cases.

6 ONLINE HATE, USED AS BAIT

Sadly, it's not just that being exposed to prejudice online is upsetting – some extreme organisations even try to recruit young people to their cause.

7 GET SOME DISTANCE

If you see messages online that upset you, it's probably time to give yourself some space from that site or app. Talk to a trusted adult about how you're feeling.

8 TURN OFF THE HATERS

If someone you follow on social media is posting sexist content, you could always mute them or block them – or unfollow them altogether.

9 PLAY IT BY THE BOOK

If you see someone discriminating online, you don't have to challenge them yourself. Screenshot their post and report them to the app or site you saw it on.

10 EXPLOITING 'PACK MENTALITY'

Sexist messages aren't always sent to a target directly: sometimes, they're posts designed to provoke misogyny among other people.

11 POSITIVITY ALWAYS WINS

Go the extra mile and spread some positive vibes! Instead of just reacting to a post and scrolling past, you could add a message of support and encouragement, too.

12 CREATE THE WORLD YOU WANT

Remember, you're the boss of your online world. Engage with posts or accounts that celebrate equality and understanding: block or unfollow the ones that don't.

Do you receive any of the following?

- Income support
- Employment Support Allowance (Income Related)

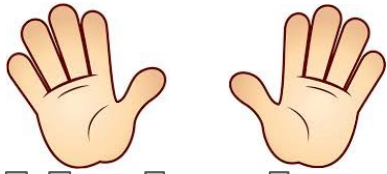

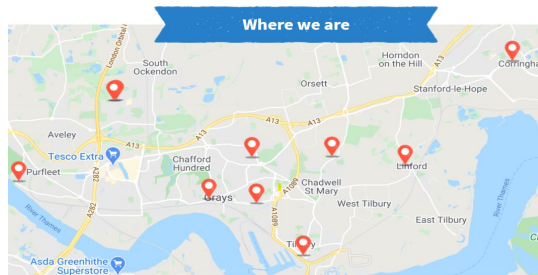
