Classroom catch up

Reception

We have come to the end of a very busy first term in Reception! This week we have looked at the story of 'Norman the Slug who saved Christmas.' by Paul Linnet and Sue Hendra. We have been using our phonics skills to sound out Christmassy CVC words. We have been trying very hard with our reading this term and are now starting to be able to read CVC on our own. We are all very proud of ourselves. We have been very busy getting creative, we have decorated baubles, made reindeers and made candy canes by threading beads onto pipe cleaners. In maths we have been practising our counting skills and recognising numbers to 20.

We have been very busy in the last two weeks practising and performing our Christmas Nativity and Carol for you all to enjoy. Everyone has been working very hard to make it amazing and all the children deserve a big congratulations!



Year 1

This week year 1 have been getting into the Christmas spirit! They have had so much fun making Christmas cards for their friends and families, creating salt dough Christmas tree decorations, and singing our Christmas carol that we have been working so hard to perfect!



Year 2

This week we finished our hand puppets. We chose between the running stitch and the over stitch to stitch the two sides of the puppet together. Once we sewed our puppet together we then used our designs to decorate our puppet to make it into our animal. We are very proud of our puppets.



As it is very close to Christmas, we made Christmas cards! We used a range of different resources to create a snowman on the front and then used our neat writing to write in the middle of the card.



Year 3

This week year 3 have been busy making the final touches to their Christmas carol performance.

This will soon be uploaded and we really hope that you enjoy it. In maths, we have been investigating the relationship between the 2, 4 and 8 times tables, consolidating our understanding of halves and doubles throughout the week. In English, we have been finishing our own narratives, based on our own version of 'The Stone Age Boy' written by Satoshi Kitamura. Our afternoons have been filled with arts and crafts this week as we have been busy creating Christmas ornaments and cards ready to bring home.

Year 4

Things have taken a festive turn in Year 4 this week. Alongside the joy of Christmas Cards, recording a Christmas song and celebrating the term, pupils have concluded the term in style.

In English, the children have been reflecting on the various adventures of Christmas elves. Each morning, pupils have discovered multiple elves between their classrooms abseiling, making snow angels and other shenanigans. Utilising recent story writing experiences, the elves helped to inspire independent story writing, including use of fronted adverbials, adjectives, alliteration, rhetorical questions, exclamations, and ellipses.

In Maths, pupils continue to learn their x6, x8 and x12 times tables. Further into the week, pupils used their four operation skills from this term in a myriad of Christmas themed Maths activities. Additionally, pupils have had the opportunity to use Hit the Button, Mathletics and TTRockstars.

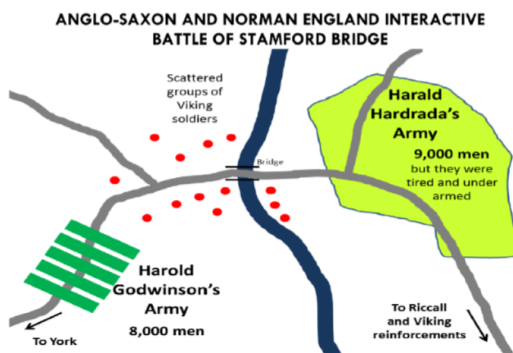
We are also pleased to say that all pupils have been read with, in time to update BugClub allocations for the holidays.

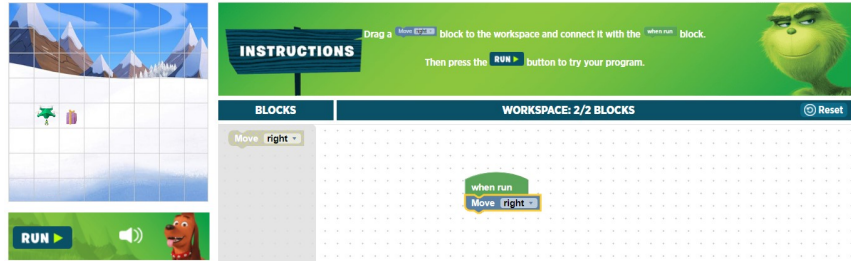

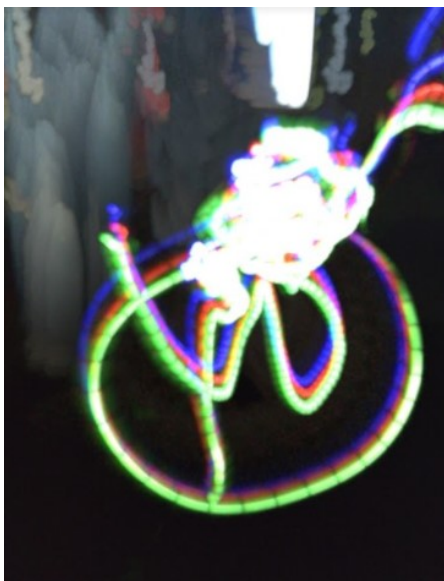
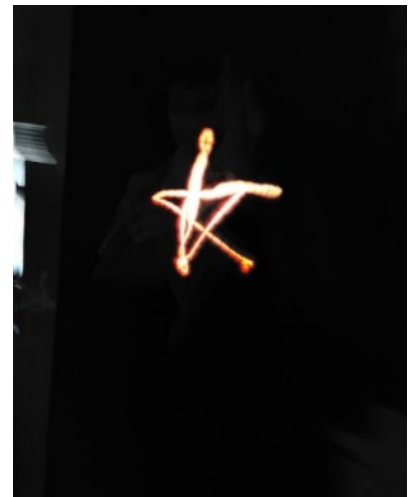
Year 6

Spend some time together researching child-friendly Christmas recipes online (the BBC Good Food site is an excellent place to start), and then you and your little elves can rustle up gingerbread santas, marshmallow snowmen or reindeer shortbread. The only thing that's more fun is eating your creations afterwards!

2 THE OLD SONGS ARE THE BEST?

We've all had that Christmas compilation CD that was almost perfect, if it wasn't inexplicably missing one of your best-loved tracks. In this era of music streaming, however, your little helpers can assist you in compiling a definitive playlist of all your favourite seasonal songs – no more pinning for The Pretenders or wishing for Wizard.

3 DECK THE HALLS

There's no such thing as 'too many' Christmas trimmings! Let your child channel their excitement into some creative crafting, and you'll make memories as well as your own DIY decorations. There are loads of step-by-step guides online (including video walkthroughs on YouTube) for seasonal showpieces like paper plate angels, handprint wreaths and cupcake wrapper Christmas trees.

4 A WINTER'S TALE

Everyone enjoys a story at this time of year: after all, the whole celebration is based on an engrossing yarn. Sites such as Audible are an excellent way of entertaining excited young ones, with classics like Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* and seasonal short stories by Enid Blyton alongside more contemporary Christmas tales by the likes of Tom Fletcher, JK Rowling and Ben Miller.

5 BROUGHT ME SOME CORN FOR POPPIN'

Snuggling up against the winter weather with the family (and a generous helping of chocolates) to enjoy a well-loved movie is a delightful Christmas tradition. The usual streaming services have some classic candidates on offer: *Home Alone* and *The Santa Clause* are on Disney+, while Amazon Prime has *Elf* and *The Grinch*, and Netflix goes with *The Princess Switch* and *The Christmas Chronicles*.

WHEN THE SNOWMAN BRINGS THE SNOW...

6 A WORLD OUTSIDE YOUR WINDOW

From turkey on the beach in Australia to roller-skating to church in Venezuela, Christmas is celebrated in a variety of ways worldwide – curious youngsters might enjoy discovering other nations' festive traditions online. Google's Santa Tracker is a brilliant (and free) starting point, with games, activities and animations to help children enjoy learning as they count down to the big day!

7 THE NEAR AND THE DEAR ONES

Between time constraints, distance, the weather and Covid precautions (or a combination of all four) for many families it just won't be possible to physically spend time with everyone they'd ideally like to this Christmas. Video calling technology, of course, takes some of the sting out of the disappointment by virtually transporting loved ones into your living room.

8 KIDS FROM ONE TO 92

If Santa's brought your young ones a console this year (or they already had one), it's a perfect excuse for some quality time while they gleefully trounce you at *FIFA* or *Mario Kart*. Digital versions of traditional board games like *Monopoly* and *Cluedo* are available on most platforms, too; get the whole household together for a modern take on some old-school family fun.

9 CAN'T WAIT TO SEE THOSE FACES

People used to express their gratitude for a thoughtful Christmas gift with a thank you card or a dutiful phone call. Not in the digital age: now your relations can see first-hand and video call how delighted the children are with their presents – and even how they look in that slightly questionable hand-knitted pullover.

10 GUESS WHAT I FORGOT?

Friends and family pitting their wits against each other on Zoom, Teams or Skype really took off during lockdown, so why not revive the tradition over the holidays? Your questions could be on the biggest news, sport and showbiz stories of 2021, or be Christmas themed, or you could stick to classic general knowledge. Ideal for those days between Christmas and New Year.

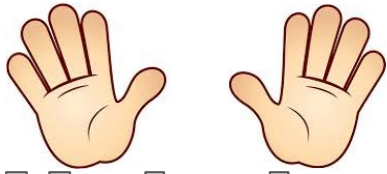

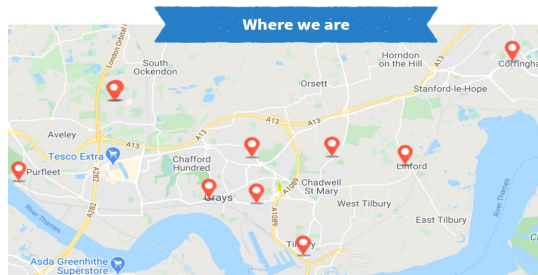
