All donations can be dropped into the school reception or handed to a member of staff at the gate.


Classoom catch up

Reception


This week in Reception we have been reading the story of 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels' by Quentin Blake. In DT, we have designed what our sock puppets are going to look like. We labelled the materials we were going to use. Next week we will be making our puppets. We are very excited. If you




In Art, we have been learning how to sew. We focused on two types of stiches; the running stitch and over stitch. We learnt how to thread the needle and

This week, in our British Values lesson, we were discussing obedience and whether we should always follow orders. We decided that you should follow orders given at home and in school and orders given to us by the police and other authority figures.

However, we also decided that if we are given an order which would endanger our safety or put us at risk, it is ok to disobey an order.

We then moved on to discussing the necessity of being obedient and following orders if you are in the military. This connected really well with the work we have been doing learning about the persecution of Jews leading-up to and during WWII. We read a true story about a mechanic in the RAF refusing to follow an order and the consequences of his actions.

Pupils then joined the defense or prosecution for the court martial.

I am defending the Chief Technician and here is my reason why. When the Chief Technician said to the Wing Commander that the plane had something wrong with the engine, the Wing Commander overruled the Chief Technician and told him to get on the plane with him and some other men. The Chief Technician said no and defied the Wing Commander. The Wing Commander made the plane take off anyway and it started going faulty in the air, luckily enough the plane landed without anyone getting hurt. Later on the Chief Technician was fired which I think was very wrong because the Chief Technician was trying to save the Wing Commanders and the other peoples lives. He shouldn't have been fired even though he was disobeying the orders of someone with a rank higher than his because he was trying to keep people safe. Also if the mission was that urgent then they could've used a different plane that was already working and ready.

He disobeyed a direct order from a superior officer then continued to try and humiliate him in front of his fellow soldiers by trying to say he was in the wrong. He has made a huge issue in our system and has held us up in our attacks. The German soldiers had a chance of killing them either way, whether the plane was broken or not. It was an order not a question and he has also been selfish as to not help in the line of duty. He is not in charge therefore he shouldn't have practically ignored his superior officer.

It is wrong to not obey an officer of a higher rank. This is because no matter the cost you are getting paid to work. Also because if you are in the navy, the air force or a soldier, it is a rule to listen to whatever your officer or leader says.






