Key Achievements to Date:

- Retention of Highly skilled PE Teacher who leads on all areas of the PE curriculum and extra-curricular activities.
- Specialist PE lead models and upskills for all staff members therefore building capacity.
- Specialist Sports companies retained yearly and activities regularly reviewed with new options selected to provide variety and increase participation.
- Subscription to the Thurrock Schools Sports Partnership has continued for the last 9 years and will continue to
 do so. More competitions and wider range of activities are added every year, including MAT activities, SEND
 activities and those for our Disadvantaged pupils.
- Gold Sports Mark achieved on numerous occasions, most recently 2018/19 cohort.

Areas for Further Improvement:

- To further raise the profile of PE within the school and within the local community.
- To purchase new and safe equipment to ensure the safety and full engagement of all of our pupils including SEND and Disadvantaged pupils. E.g. Adapted equipment to allow more enjoyment, accelerated learning, engagement and progress.
- Specialist coaches working with identified groups to raise self-esteem, social skills and instill healthy lifestyle choices.
- Competition clothing to further raise the profile of PE in the school and local community, raise self-esteem, pride in our school and ownership of their achievements.
