This term we will be learning with a central idea of 'Earth Matters', which will encompass sustainability and ways we can look after our wonderful world. With this idea in mind, our reading text as a Year Group is The Lorax, by Dr. Seuss. In English, we will be continuing to develop our writing and grammar skills through the mediums of biographies, narratives and script writing. In mathematics, and in accordance with the White Rose Scheme of Work, we will be learning multiplication and division concepts, area of shapes, fractions and decimals, in addition to focusing predominantly the 7, 9 and 11 times tables – though all times tables will be an important part of this terms learning. In science, we are exploring sound and electricity, and how it is produced through enquiry and investigations. Across Foundation subjects we are learning a range of aspects, from geographic and historical aspects of our planet to culinary and media skills, including exploring natural parts of the planet including rivers, volcanoes and human and physical features. In PE, we will be learning Gymnastics and Dance routines in the respective half-terms.

Home learning

Home learning tasks will be assigned, alongside spellings, weekly on a Friday and are due to be handed in on Thursday. Tasks will account for pupil's current in-school learning and will be supportive in developing their ideas. In addition to spellings, pupils are also expected to practise timetables on a weekly basis, and as such will be quizzed on both on a Friday.
