Overview

The learning in Year 5 this term will be based around the Maya civilisation (History) and then Oceans (Geography). In English, pupils will focus on narrative writing, biographies, and poetry. As a school, we follow the White Rose scheme of work in Maths. This half term, pupils will be taught about multiplication of numbers with more than one digit, fractions, decimals, and division strategies. During foundation lessons – usually in the afternoons – students will be learning about the Mayan civilisation through the following subjects: Art, History and Design Technology. In Science, we will conclude our work on forces and we will then explore Space. Children will also look at 'Individual Liberty' and 'Mutual Respect' during British Values sessions and they will explore their rights as individuals, as well as how to mutually respect each other and embrace individuality. Computing this term will be focused on programming, where pupils will be challenged to create loops and conditions for a digital device. During RE this term, our focus will be Christianity, places of worship and alternative belief systems, whilst PSHE deals with the environment, social media, and aspirations for our futures. Our PE focus for Spring Term 1 will be dance and badminton.

Home learning

Home learning tasks will be set weekly on a Friday and are due back on Thursday. Reading should be completed at least 5 times a week and recorded in their reading diaries.

Things you can do to support your child at home

The children should be able to complete the spelling and maths tasks independently, but may need support in reading the questions. It is a good thing if they make mistakes. This will identify to class teachers where the children need support when they are in school. By all means support them but let the children do the home learning and let them make mistakes!
